

Slit - Seeding



Slit-seeding is the best method for overseeding. Our Ryan Mataway Overseeder has verticutting blades that cut through the thatch and soil layer and open up a slit or miniature furrow into the soil. The slits are on 2" spacings. The concave disk blades on the unit follow in the slits and keep them open while the seed is dropped via a delivery system that feeds the seed directly into the slits. This method ensures more seed gets into the soil where it can germinate. Slit-seeding also generally takes less seed than broadcast seeding, because most of the seed gets into the soil so it can germinate.

Slit-seeding can be done to fill in bare spots, to improve the density of the existing turf, to improve grass varieties, or to enhance lawn colour. The advantage to this method is that it can be done without tearing up turf or the soil. It is considerably less labour intensive.

Newer turfgrass seed varieties have been developed to better withstand insects, disease, drought, shady conditions and heavy traffic better. Proper selection of a quality grass seed will result in a renovated lawn that stays greener and looks healthier.
